German Language Courses	Incoming exchange students can take <u>German language courses</u> free of charge if space is available. Pre-semester intensive language courses (usually A1-B1) start approx. two weeks prior to the start of the semester.
Program and Course Restrictions	All faculties of Universität Hamburg are open for exchange students. The final decision on acceptance is taken by the faculties. Closed for exchange students: dentistry, pharmacy. The Faculty of Medicine will accept applications only once per year . Please make sure to nominate students interested in studying at the Faculty of Medicine in the following academic year before the nomination deadline of 10 April . Students need to have completed at least three years of studies prior to exchange and provide proof of German language proficiency level B1 CEFR.
Semester Fees	All students of Universität Hamburg, including exchange students, pay a mandatory contribution fee per semester (reduced fee for exchange students in winter semester 2020/21: approx. EUR 278), which includes a public transport pass for the Hamburg Public Transport Area.

	semester: end of May; summer semester: end of November). The students
	will be guided through the registration process at Universität Hamburg
	and provided with information on housing, course selection etc.
