A student discount pass can be purchased ("Imagin'R"). For more information, please check the website:</li> <li>http://www.imagine-r.com/</li> <li>Food (€): €250/month</li> <li>Cinema tickets (€): around €10 (student discounts available)</li> <li>N.B: it is very difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job. It is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected cost of their stay in Paris, which should be at least €1000 per month (or equivalent in the student's currency) for the expected period of stay.</li> <li>N.B: Please note that Université de Paris does not provide scholarships for incoming exchange students.</li> </ul>
